At the time of my writing this we are working on filling an open position on the board. We still have need of volunteers to help maintain landscape beds in the neighborhood. Our landscape chairs have been working for over 9 years to keep our neighborhood looking beautiful. They are ready for someone else to step up and take over this responsibility. Thanks to Treasurer Tom Coit Very important for our Community and for the Cougar Ridge Association to take a moment to recognize our Treasurer **Tom Coit** for all his hard work over the past few months. We had been using QuickBooks accounting software for financial management but the software we were using was no longer being supported. QuickBooks new software is only available via an online subscription and would have cost the association close to \$100 per month. Through Tom's efforts we were able to secure a grant for nonprofits from Oracle to use their NetSuite accounting software at no cost to the association. Tom has worked tirelessly since February to prepare our accounts for transfer and making sure the transfer goes smoothly. We transitioned to using NetSuite on May 1, 2023.

Painted and Pond Turtles Found in Cougar Ridge



Turtles Need Our Help to Survive
How amazing is it to live in a neighborhood where the turtles come to nest! There are painted turtles and western pond turtles in the Cougar Ridge area, and just a short walk down to McLane Creek, we can see the turtles sunning themselves on the logs or swimming in the pond. Each spring and summer, the turtles make their way to the bottom of Capitol Forest Loop and Capitol Creek Drive. The painted turtles are quite common, but the western pond turtles, smaller and rounder, are becoming more and more rare, as they need our help to survive.

Drive Slowly and Carefully
Often, they will cross the road, dig their nests along the side of the road, and lay anywhere from 2 to 20 eggs. Two to three months later, the babies hatch and eventually attempt to make their way back to the pond. Needless to say, this process is filled with danger. The dark shells can be hard to see on the asphalt. So how can we help? Be especially careful to drive slowly and watch for turtles along Capitol Forest Loop and Capitol Creek Lane. In addition, please keep dogs on a leash and from digging in those areas where there are nests.

Please Refrain From Picking Them Up
The female turtles have begun their migration from
McLane Pond and Beatty Creek into our neighborhood to dig their nests and lay their eggs. It's tempting to pick them up and look at the undersides, but
please don't. They carry with them a reserve of water
and urine, which they use to soften the ground when
they dig their nests. If you pick them up, they will pee
out the urine on you, and that may cause them to have
trouble digging their nests.

What a Privilege!

So, take a walk down to the lower part of Capitol Forest Loop this month, and maybe you'll see a turtle or two crossing the road, digging a nest, or just resting. What a privilege! More information is available at: https://wdfw.wa.gov/species-habitats/species/chrysemyspicta#regs-seasons

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Cougar Ridge Neighborhood Watering Schedule - Spring/Summer 2023



Outdoor Watering Schedule in Effect

- ✓ Addresses ending with an odd number may water and irrigate outdoors on MONDAY, WEDNESDAY, & FRIDAY.
- ✓ Addresses ending with an even number can water and irrigate outdoors on TUESDAY, THURSDAY, & SATURDAY.
- The HOA Common Areas will follow the even number schedule to balance the load on the water system.
- Homeowners are encouraged to water in the evening, night time, or early morning hours.

No Water in the Well? It Has Happened!
On a hot July day in 2015, neighbors were not so pleasantly surprised to find that there was no water. It had been exceptionally hot and dry for weeks and it appeared that everyone had turned on their sprinkler systems daily for several days on end, and had basically run the tank dry. That is when the volunteer system of odd/even watering was implemented and it has worked very well throughout the hot summers that our area continues to have. Cougar Ridge Neighbors Please Obey The Rules

- Always drive carefully and follow the 25 mph speed limit.
 - Watch for children playing on or near the street.
- Dog walkers and owners: <u>always pick up after your pet</u> when walking in the neighborhood.
- When you pick up your mail remember to check that the Mail Kiosk security gates are closed.
 - Conceal your garbage bins from street view.
 - Help keep our neighborhood clean and beautiful with regular yard maintenance.
 - To prevent fires in our forested areas, please remove piles of yard debris, especially during the warm and dry summer months.
 - It is important to keep street trees, shrubs, and branches pruned back, to maintain a safe line of sight for school buses, garbage trucks, and any other vehicles that drive through the neighborhood.
 - Remember to pay assessments on time.
 - Please observe the CC&Rs that help maintain our clean, safe, and beautiful neighborhood.
 - Participation on and support for Cougar Ridge Committees, the Board of Directors, and the spring and fall cleanup days are encouraged and much appreciated.
